Hypothyroidism is thyroid hormone deficiency. Symptoms in infants include poor feeding and growth failure; symptoms in older children and adolescents are similar to those of adults but also include growth failure, delayed puberty, or both. Diagnosis is by thyroid function testing (eg, serum thyroxine, thyroid-stimulating hormone).

In general, severe congenital abnormalities present in infancy whereas less severe defects or acquired abnormalities, particularly autoimmune thyroid disease, develop later in childhood and adolescence.

Congenital hypothyroidism refers to a deficiency or lack of thyroid hormone that is present at birth. Genetic defects or maternal iodine deficiency can result in problems with thyroid gland development or with thyroid hormone production, giving rise to the condition. Usually, newborn screening tests identify congenital hypothyroidism.

The most common cause of thyroid problems in infants is improper growth of the thyroid gland during pregnancy. Some babies are born without a thyroid gland, and some thyroid problems stem from understimulation of the thyroid by the pituitary gland.
